INTRODUCTION

Pollution Prevention Resource Center (PPRC) is the Nortwest Region's largest nonprofit organization that provides on-the-ground technical assistance to organizations seeking to reduce pollution at its source and improve economic vitality. PPRC has worked with the Clackamas River Water Provider (CRWP) since 2014 to deliver technical assistance and outreach to automotive businesses and landscapers using the EcoBiz Certification standards. PPRC has also been working with CRWP since 2016 to implement CRWP's Hazardous Material Spill Prevention Program to help protect their drinking water source.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

During the 2024/25 fiscal year, PPRC contracted with CRWP to continue implementation of Hazardous Materials Spill Prevention Program. The following table outlines the Proposed Tasks and Completed Activities during this fiscal year.

Perform outreach at businesses that could receive hazardous material education and technical assistance. 

Thanks to a referral by Clackamas County Water Environment Services, PPRC worked with Western Systems to identify and purchase needed spill containment equipment both inside and outside of their facility. Pictured above are, left to right, is the company's inside work area before and after use of a spill containment dolly. The dolly allows barrels of hydraulic oil to be moved around the facility and contain any drips or spills. Equipment was purchased by PPRC using funds provided by CRWP.








Pictured above are, left to right, the company's outdoor used oil storage area before and after installation of a covered shed which contains an internal spill pallet. The unique design of the shed ensures the areas rain water runoff is not contaminated by the residue oil from the drums and the floors "drip pan" design easily contains any unexpected spillage which may happen while transferring oil into the drums.
